





Business Meeting Minutes 781st BS Association

October 10, 2007

The 2007 meeting of the 781st Bomb Squadron Association was held in the Comfort Inn in Arlington, VA, October 10, 2007. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 hours by President Barney Russell. Chaplain Orren Lee gave an opening prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited. The minutes of the last meeting were read by Secretary Orren Lee and ap-

The financial report was given by




Treasurer Ken Kill. The checking account was reported at \$132.44 + cups and caps that have been sold at this reunion bringing the total to \$272.44. The savings account balance is \$39,340.56. The reunion account is \$269.90.

A motion to accept the report was made by John Fandrey and seconded by Bernie Badler.

Old Business: The tabled motion to give \$30,000.00 to the SAC Museum to create a scholarship fund was brought back to the floor. Earl Leinart gave a further report on the Strategic AF Museum in Omaha as a place for the funds we have inherited and our memorabilia. He had a proposal for SAC Museum in Omaha to establish a scholarship fund in the 781st name leaving the amount to be decided on by the membership. They would accept our memorabilia, catalog it and store it in climate controlled archival storage area. Regularly the Museum rotates artifacts for public display.

Frank Wassenaar reported on the Air Force Memorial in Washington D.C. and others they had investigated. He reported that none had a program such as SAC. Ron Soucy had investigated Wright Patterson. He reported they would not accept our



recommend them as a location for our funds or memorabilia.

John Fandrey requested McCook, NE be looked at. After discussion a motion to table the motion until the next business meeting was made by Bernie Badler. The motion was seconded and carried.

A quorum established at 21 members present.

A motion was made by John Fandrey to amend the Constitution to increase eligibility to any member of a family of the 781st Bomb Squadron that served at Pantanella Air Base in Italy or any person dedicated to preserving the history of the association by paying dues can become an associate member and be eligible to vote and hold office.

The Amendment to Article IV as proposed and published was: Amendment #1

All family members of 781st Bomb Squadron Veterans or any person dedicated to preserving the history of the association upon payment of dues shall be considered an associate member and become a voting member and eligible to hold office.

The motion was seconded and carried.

New Business: Honorarium for Executive Secretary was refused by Carole Lee.

Reunion report: 21 members attending. With family members there will be 77 for the banquet. Recognition was made of work done by Ken and Betty Kill, Marcel Snyder, Carole Lee and Frank Ambrose. President Barney called for location of 2009 reunion.



Marcel Snyder presented two proposals. 1) Charlotte Zartman will arrange in Phoenix as she proposed in Fairfield, Ca. 2) Ralph Hendrickson has a proposal for a cruise to the Caribbean. He has a price below \$500.00 per person which includes room and meals.

Ron Soucy questioned the location of 2008. President Barney said that was decided last year. President Barney called for any other proposals for 2009. Frank Ambrose suggested no decision on 2009 be made until new members were able to vote on the location. He made a motion to table until then. Seconded and passed.

Frank Ambrose reported the following slate of officers from the nominating committee and made a motion to accept the slate.

Bernard Badler for Vice President.
Ken Kill for Treasurer.
Connie Ogden for Secretary.
Directors: Earl Leinart, Frank
Wassenaar, and Frank Ambrose

As there were no other nominations the slate was elected by acclamation.

Orren Lee, incoming president, requested a new chaplain be appointed. Barney called for volunteers. Orren nominated Frank Wassenaar. Seconded and carried.

Earl Leinart and Marcel Snyder questioned tabling the motion regarding the museum. It was overruled by President Barney as he stated the motion was tabled.

Bernie Badler read a letter from Dr. Rapaport greeting the reunion attendees.

President Barney Russell asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ron Soucy questioned whether it was ever voted on to hold the reunion in Dayton.

Bob Freed made the motion to hold the 2008 reunion in Dayton, Ohio, Dale Kaiser seconded. Ron then reported he investigated holding the reunion in Dayton as the minutes had reported and has made some arrangements for October 4th through

October 7th of 2008 at Wright Patterson AFB. Hope Hotel. Reasoning that you have to reserve a year and a half in advance for a meal on the museum floor, he did that in case we voted to have our reunion there.

IMPORTANT NOTICE DO NOT PHONE REGISTRYAssure against being dropped off the Do-Not-Call Registry

The federal Do-Not-Call list has been in existence for almost five years now. Because registrations are valid for five years, those who signed onto the list in its early days will automatically be dropped off the list beginning in June 2008 unless they enroll again.

For those who are not familiar with this program, telemarketers covered by the national "Do Not Call" Registry have up to 31 days from the date you first register to stop calling you.

Under federal law, your number will stay in the registry for five years, or until it is

disconnected, or until you delete it from the registry. You may renew your registration at any time for another five years.

If you changed your phone number, you must also re-register. You are allowed to register cell numbers.

You can check the date your registration will expire by going online to http://www.donotcall.gov/default.aspx and clicking on "Verify a Registration."

You can renew your registration at any time by clicking on "Register a phone number."


You may also re-register by phone, call toll-free (888) 382-1222, but you must call from the phone number you wish to register.


While there is still time before the June expiration date, it is good to start thinking about re-registering and confirming that you are on the registry.











What Do You Talk About At A Reunion...


"An Easter Egg for Hitler"

To this day the photo still appears in many historical books and on

The only two men that are still alive shown in the photo are John Zadrozny and Pete Ministrelli. Pete is shown at the far right leaning on the Easter Egg' and John appears standing in the rear, third man from the left.

The highly emotional service began and ended with great pageantry as the Posting and Retiring of the Colors was executed by members of the "Armed Forces Color Guard.


Following the Pledge to the Flag an Invocation was given by Post Chaplain, Coffman.

November 30, 2007-The Strategic Air & Space Museum in Ashland, Nebraska was pleased to accept a generous donation last month from a member of the 781st Bomb Squadron (H) Association. A \$3,500 gift of endowment has been given to establish the 781st. Bomb Squadron (H) Remembrance Endowment, in remembrance of the forty-six men of the 781st who died in combat, and all the other men of the Squadron who have folded wings since.

The earnings from the Endowment Fund, not the principal, will provide scholar-ship opportunities to deserving students who wish to participate in the Museum's Flight Camps. The Museum serves over 25,000 students annually through innovative educational programming aimed at creating an interest in fields such as aviation and aerospace through math and science applications.

The donor gave additional books, writings, papers, and personal memorabilia and artifacts pertaining to the 81st. Bomb Squadron. They will be placed in the Strategic Air & Space Museum's permanent collection. This, and such other donated personal memorabilia, will be preserved in air conditioned and humidity controlled storage for research and rotated display.

781st Membership No Longer Restricted to Pantanella Vets

An important amendment was added to our constitution during this years' business meeting.

Up to then only veterans that had served at Pantanella Base during WWII were eligible to become members of the Association. As time passed, it became increasing evident that in order to carry on and perpetuate the unit, eligibility should be made available to any family member and or any others dedicated to preserving our heritage.

Deputy Director of the Strategic Air & Space Museum, Steve Prall, said "the Museum is grateful for the creation of this endowment to help the Museum fulfill its educational mission." "There is a strong bond that is forged between men who have faced a danger together. It gives me a good feeling to start such an endowment fund and collection in their memory. I am convinced that, in time, both the collection and fund will grow," said the donor.

I want to thank you for your confidence in electing me President and am honored to serve the Association. I have made many good friends and always enjoy the reunions.


