finally came up with an agenda which appears to become as good a reunion as all of the previous reunions before.


Negotiations along with the Astor Hotel has been completed as well as with the National WWII Museum for an interesting and informative day there.

The Natchez Riverboat

Natchez has been the name of several steamboats, and four naval vessels, each named after the city of Natchez, Mississippi. The current one has been in operation since 1975. The previous Natchez were all operated in the nineteenth century, most by Captain Thomas P. Leathers. Each of the steamboats since Leathers' first had as its ensign a cotton bale between its stacks.



The current Natchez is based in New Orleans, Louisiana. . She is operated by the New Orleans Steamboat Company and docks at the Toulouse Street Wharf. Day trips include harbor and dinner cruises along the Mississippi River.

The Natchez IX is modeled after the steamboats Hudson and Virginia. Her steam engines were originally built in 1925 for the steamboat Clairton, from which the steering system also came. The copper bell was made of 250 melted silver dollars. The Natchez IX also features a steam calliope that can play 32 notes. The wheel is made of white oak and steel, is 25 feet (7.6 m) by 25 feet (7.6 m), and weighs over 26 tons.[2] The whistle came from a ship that sank in 1908 on the Monagabola River.

Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base New Orleans

NAS JRB New Orleans is one of three Joint Reserve Bases in the country that serve and house commands from various branches of the Armed Services. NAS JRB New Orleans currently supports three Naval Air Squadrons, two Marine units, a Coast Guard Air Station, a Louisiana Air National Guard detachment, an Army unit, an Fleet Readiness Center, a Navy Reserve Operational Support Center, and other support units.

Nearly 5,000 military and Department of Defense civilian employees work at the base daily, and approximately 1,700 family members live in more than 900 housing units.

The 159 Fighter Wing contains one of the Air National Guard's premier F-15 fighter wings with a trained force of more than 1500 men and women.

The 159th Fighter Wing, along with its operational flying unit, the 122nd Fighter Squadron (122 FS) is tasked to provide air superiority over Louisiana and the Gulf Coast while supporting USNORTH-COM and NORAD.

To perform this vital role requires active air defense alert 24 hours a day, 365 days a year at the Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base New Orleans.

A parent unit of the 159th Fighter Wing, the 122nd Fighter Squadron is an active unit and flies the F-15C/D Eagle.

Frank Wassenaar:

Bombadier: Doss Crew

Or. Frank Wassenaar, age 88, passed away May 3, at his home in Alma Michigan, May 21, 2011.

Frank was born on February 23, 1923. He graduated from Coopersville High School in 1940 and went on to enlist in the Army Air Corp in WW II where he served as a first lieutenant bombardier navigator on **B-24** Liberators in the 15th Air



Force in Italy. Military service was an important part of his life, and most recently he had served as the Military Chaplin and Board member for the 15th Air Force reunion group of the 781 Squadron.

He married Dorothy Miller in 1944 in Royal Oak, Michigan. They would have celebrated their 68th wedding anniversary this month. He graduated from the University of Detroit Dental School in 1951 nd started his first practice in Holland, Michigan. In 1952 he moved to Alma and practiced dentistry for 53 years before his retirement in 2005. He was a member of The First Presbyterian Church and served in many leadership roles. He especially loved singing in the Chancel choir.

Frank was very active in the Alma-St. Louis Rotary Club, served as President, and loved his role as a song leader in recent years. He participated in the Rotary student exchange program and he and his family hosted many students over the years. He had a special relationship with exchange daughter Runa Fukaya Yasui of Nagoya, Japan. He was also a member of Pine River Country Club, Otsego Ski Club, Crystal Golf Club and the Alma Masonic Lodge.

Frank was a member of the Crystal Sailing Club, sailing Flying Dutchman and Flying Scots for many years. He also enjoyed making jewelry, gardening and making mats and picture frames for his wife Dottie. He was often affectionately known as "Frank the Framer."

Surviving Frank are his wife Dottie, his son, Kurt Wassenaar of Charlottesville, Virginia; his two daughters, Sara Wasnaar (Rich Frutiger) of Alma and Mona Miles) Hirson of Rye, New York; his four grandchildren, John Frutiger, Miles and Reid Hirson, and Kia Wassenaar.

Morris R. "Doc" Rapoport: 781st Sqd. Flight Surgeon

It is with great sadness that we report the loss of our father, Squadron Flight Surgeon, Capt.. Morris R. "Doc" Rapoport, of Scarsdale, New York.

He joined the ranks of the Folded Wings squadron on March 5, 2011, passing quietly and peacefully at home after a short illness, with his beloved wife of 66 years, Blanche, by his side. He was three weeks shy of 97 years old.

"Doc" was born in the Bronx, New York in 1914, the son of Rose and Max Rapoport. He graduated from New York University and the University of Glasgow Medical College. He began his internship at the Bronx Hospital in 1939, and enlisted immediately after Pearl Harbor, in January 1942. His brother, the late Carl, served in the Pacific theatre and his brother Bernard was in the intelligence service in the European theatre.

He began his AAF career in Panama City, Florida and ultimately was assigned to the 781st Bombardment Squadron in 1943. We have attached "Doc's" story of the 781st in his own words.

We grew up with stories of the 781st. He told us of the heroics of the pilots and the flight crews and the land crews. He regaled us with stories of his ambulance "Heaven Can Wait," how he and his ambulance anxiously waited on the tarmac for the return of his planes after their mission. He delighted us with stories of his dispensing of the whiskey and of pilots and co-pilots who felt, as he said, closer to each other than most husbands and wives.

He told us of the 781st with such joy and pride that we grew up feeling as if we were members of the squadron. He would laugh and smile and recount with great detail the names and places and missions. It was a source of great pride for our father that he flew missions with his pilots, that he shared their terror and thrills; Dad felt he had to experience air combat so that he could better care for the pilots and crews.

After the war he practiced general medicine in the Bronx, New York, specializing in allergy, and caring for generations of families, school children, and delivering countless babies, and their babies. He was on the staffs of Montefiore Hospital and Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center. Doc retired after 46 years of practice and was beloved by his patients and their families alike.

In retirement Doc and Blanche divided their time between Palm Beach and Scarsdale, always including in their travels visits to the 781st reunions and friends. Our mother always told us how welcomed she was at the Panatella


