Contrary to statements made at recent reunions, the spirit of the 781st Bomb Squadron Association is alive and well--

This year's Reunion got off to a great start with Betty Ambrose and Connie Ogden at the Registration Table which was set up in the Holiday Inn NASA lobby. All but two parties were registered Sunday afternoon.

Meanwhile, in the Hospitality Room, muscle men Ken Kill, Frank Ambrose and John Ogden moved the supplies, obtained ice and set up the facilities. The room was opened by 3:00 P.M. and soon became the hub of activity. For every afternoon and evening thereafter the members congregated to socialize, enjoy and avail of themselves the amenities the room had to offer.

Monday began with a visit to Space Center Houston. Numerous displays of Astronaut equipment and memorabilia and an I-Max theatre featuring 2 films on Space Activities were on the agenda. A tram tour of the NASA campus featured stops at the Old Mission Control Center (MCC), now a "National Historic Landmark", 'Hanger X', which contained hands on displays of experimental spacecraft. Also on the tour was a stop at 'Building 8' which was of great interest since it was filled with various Space and Shuttle mock-ups in which the Astronauts train.

Getting up to the original Mission Control Center Observation Room proved to be an ordeal. The Observation Room overlooks the Control Center and is normally serviced by an elevator. However this day the elevator was inoperative. With all the technology that NASA possesses it lacked the means of repairing it. Accessing the Observation Room now required a climb of 87 steps. All but two of our members climbed and then finally crawled the 87 steps to see the display. The climb was worth it and com-

The speaker of the evening was Mr. John Connolly, of the NASA Astronaut Office. His subject was 'The Shuttle Columbia Investigation', with which he was intimately involved. Mr. Connolly was in charge of a debris recovery team of the ill-fated Columbia Mission. He was also involved in investigating the probable causes and remedies of the accident.

His presentation consisted of actual photographs of the recovery effort and video footage of the suspected cause of the disaster. With the aid of a large model he was able to pinpoint the exact locations of the damage. Utilizing the model and shifting from still photos to video and back he kept the audience's rapt attention for the entire presentation. As a

memento, Connolly presented each attendee with a 'Columbia Memorial' lapel pin. Following the presentation cameras began clicking and flashing all over the place as small groups and individu-

als were posing and photographing each other

Many of the group retired to the hospitality room after saying their "Good-Byes" to the early leavers. Lively discussions took place to well after the 11:00 P.M. curfew. The reunion ended on a very upbeat note.



CONSTITUTION OF THE 781st BOMB SQUADRON ASSOCIATION 465th BOMB GROUP Amended September 17, 2003

ARTICLE I - NAME

The organization created by this constitution shall be known as the 781st Bomb Squadron Association (465th Bomb Group)

ARTICLE II- LOCATION
The association reunions will be held
annually anywhere in
the United States voted
upon by the members
during such national
meetings.

ARTICLE III- PURPOSE a) This association is a nonprofit benefit association and is not organized for the private gain of any person, it is not organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Association Law for public purposes.

b) The objective of this association shall be to promote close social relations among its members and their families.

c) To preserve the friendship, memo-

- ries and incidents of the Association as members of the 781st Bomb Squadron (465th Bomb Group) during World War II.
 d) To hold and participate in national
- reunions held by the Association members.
- e) To engage in charitable efforts related to

the members of Veterans Organizations.

f) Not withstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers, this Association shall not engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the specific purpose of this Association.

ARTICLE IV-MEMBERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

a) All personnel that were members of the 781st Bomb Squadron(465th Bomb Group) and served at Pantanella Air Base, Italy during World War II. b) Spouses of all of the above are considered honorary members, not subject to paying dues.


 c) Widows of members can, by payment of dues, continue as honorary members. (Non voting)

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

a) The elective officers of this Association shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary and/or Treasurer.

b) The appointive officers of this Association shall be Committee Chairmen, as appointed by the President.

c) Nomination for the various offices

shall be made by the membership, but not more than four (4) members may be nominated for any one office.

ARTICLE VI- MEETINGS AND QUORUMS

 a) Regular meetings of the Association shall be called at any time desirable, at dates times and places determined by the elected officers of the Association.

 b) Special meetings may be called by the President or upon request of 15 Association members.

c) A quorum shall consist of 50% of those members registered for the reunion and present at the business meeting.

- d) Each member shall be entitled to have an equal vote. There shall be no distinction relative to grade or rank held by any member while in the military service, of the Association, or order of business. One session at any reunion shall be devoted to the business of the Association. At such a session the following will be the order of business of the Association.
- (e) At such a session, the following will be the order of business
- 1) Meeting called to order by the President.
- 2) Roll call of personnel that have registered.
- 3) Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.
- 4) Committee reports.
- 5) Old business.
- 6) New business.
- 7) Nomination of officers.
- 8) Election of officers.
- 9) Installation of officers.
- 10) Adjournment

ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

There shall be 3 standing committees whose duties shall be as follows:

- 1) Membership. Shall be responsible for contacting inactive members, to determine if they wish to become active.
- 2) Reunion. Shall be responsible for selecting a site and for planning the reunion activities.
- 3) Historian. Responsible for researching the history of the 781st Bomb Squadron (465th Bomb Group) and preparing a booklet of the history for association members. b) Other Committee Chairmen. The President shall appoint other committee chairmen as deemed necessary.

781st BOMB SQUADRON ASSOCIATION 465th BOMB GROUP BYLAWS

AMENDED SEPTEMBER 17, 2003

ARTICLE I -DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

- 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the association. He shall appoint the chairman and members of all committees and specify (to them) their functions and duties. The President will also perform all other duties pertaining to this office.
- 2. The Vice President shall perform all duties pertaining to the office of the President in his absence. In case of vacancy, he shall succeed to that office.
- 3. The Treasurer shall be charged with the custody of the funds, including all dues and shall keep accounts for and make a report thereon at each regular meeting. His accounts shall be audited annually by a committee of 3 members appointed by the President. He shall pay all bills.
- 4. The Secretary shall keep in permanent form the minutes of all meetings, record the correct names and adresses of all members and perform all other duties pertaining to his office.

ARTICLE II ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 1. The officers of this association, shall be elected by a written ballot of those members present and a majority vote shall be required to constitute a valid election. If at any time a candidate for offices does not receive a majority vote on a ballet count, the two candidates having the most votes cast for them will be considered as candidates for revote.
- 2. Those officers elected will assume office upon completion of business during each national reunion election.
- **3.** Any member may nominate another member as a candidate for any office at the time of election of officers.
- 4. Should an officer resign before the next national election, the senior elected officer shall appoint a member in good standing to temporarily assume the office. He shall then direct the secretary to send notice to the membership of the appointment prior to the next business meeting at which time the vacancy shall be filled.

5. Terms of office shall terminate at each national reunion or until their successors are installed or appointed.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- 1. There shall be an annual fee of \$10.00 hereinafter called annual dues, payable in advance, on or before the end January; the association year to run concurrent with the calendar year from January to December 31.
- 2. Life membership, currently not available, can be reinstituted by the direction of the Board of Directors, and will make a member paid up for life, by the payment of a fee as directed by the board.
- 3. Such payment of annual dues constitutes the payee a member of the 781st Squadron Association (465th Bomb Group).
- 4 Membership annual dues may be raised or lowered form time to time if deemed necessary by the president and approved by a majority vote of the members at the annual meeting.
- **5.** A registration fee may be required to take care of incidental expenses of any meeting called by officers of the association. Such expenses will be reviewed and approved and the officers are hereby authorized to see that all just debts of the association are paid.
- **6.** The Pantanella News will be issued quarterly in support of Article III of the Constitution.
- 7. In the event it becomes advisable or necessary to disband this association, the property of this association is irrevocably dedicated to Veterans Association purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this association shall ever inure to the benefit of any officer or members thereof or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding down

- of the association, its assets remaining after payment of all debts and liabilities of this association shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for veterans welfare purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section (cX4) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- **8.** The organization receiving these funds will be studied and evaluated by the current Assets Management Committee. Recommendations will go forward to the Board of Directors for action. Any matters pertaining to assets allocation will be the province of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV- COMMITTEES

1. The President shall appoint such committees as he considers necessary at any time, or as directed on the majority vote of the members present at any business meeting. He shall appoint such committees as they direct.

ARTICLE V-AMENDMENTS

- 1. In order to change the Bylaws, the membership must be notified by mail in sufficient time to vote on such change or changes in the Bylaws at the Annual Reunion Meeting.
- **2.** Any change or changes voted upon and approved by the membership will be incorporated into the association bylaws and become effective immediately.

ARTICLE VI ADOPTION

1. The Constitution and Bylaws and subsequent amendments hereto shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

ARTICLE VII.


PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The Saga of the "LADY BE GOOD" Information courtesy of the USAF Museum



At 2:50 p.m. on Apr. 4, 1943, 25 B-24Ds of the 376th Bomb Group took off from their AAF base at Soluch, Libya, for a high-altitude bombing attack against harbor facilities at Naples, Italy. All planes but one returned safely to Allied territory that night--the one which was missing was the Lady Be Good.

Almost 16 years later on Nov. 9th, 1958, several British geologists were flying over the desolate, sun-baked Libyan Desert. At approximately 400 miles south of Soluch, they spotted an aircraft on the sand. A ground party which reached the site in March 1959 discovered the plane to be a B-24D. The "Lady Be Good" had been found.

Evidence at the site indicated that the crew had become lost in the dark on return from Naples and had flown over their base and southward into the desert. As their fuel supply became depleted, the nine men aboard had bailed out but had disappeared while attempting to walk northward to civilization.

Intensive searches were made for clues as to the fate of the crew and in 1960 the remains of eight were found, one near the plane and the other seven far to the north. Five had trekked 78 miles across the tortuous sand before perishing and one had gone an amazing 109 miles. In addition, they had lived eight days rather than only two expected of men in this area with little or no water. The body of the ninth man was never found.

Numerous parts from the "Lady Be Good" were returned to the U.S. for technical study. Also, some of the parts were installed in other planes, aircraft which then experienced unexpected difficulties. A \tilde{C} -54 in which several autosyn transmitters were installed had propeller trouble and made a safe landing only by throwing cargo overboard. A C-47 in which a radio receiver was

installed ditched in the Mediterranean, and a U.S. Army "Otter" airplane in which a "Lady Be Good" seat armrest was installed crashed in the Gulf of Sidra with 10 men aboard. No trace was ever found of any of them; one of the few pieces washed ashore was the armrest of the "Lady Be Good."

The window in the foyer of Chapel 2, Wright-Patterson AFB, is a replica of the stained glass window from the Chapel at Wheelus AFB, Libya commemorating the courage of the crew of the B-24 Lady Be Good who perished in the desert in 1943. Funds for the design and manufacture of the window in 1960 were donated by USAF personnel of the 72nd Air Base Wing stationed at Wheelus AFB.

The ill-fated crew of the Lady Be Good were:-1st Lt. W. J. Hatton, Pilot; 2d Lt. R. F. Toner, Copilot; 2d Lt. D.P. Hays, Navigator; 2d Lt. J.S. Woravka, Bombardier; T/Sgt. H.J. Ripslinger, Engineer; T/Sgt. R.E LaMotte, Radio Operator; S/Sgt. G.E. Shelly, Gunner; S/Sgt. V.L. Moore, Gunner; S/Sgt. S.E. Adams, Gunner.


