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# SOMETHING THAT CONCERNS EACH OF US:

When the 783RD Bomb Squadron Association was formed and we were asked to serve we assumed it was for the purpose of reuniting the many who had served with the 'Ole Outfit'; provide them with periodic bulletins informing them of old friends and happenings; and hold AFFORDABLE Reunions ever two years where the 'troops' could join together and once again share the great fellowship that made the Squadron so outstanding and unique.

Today, these memories are becoming disillusioned. Have we lost that concern for our Squadron mate that has been less fortunate and no longer care to share? Are we headed on the correct course? These questions and others are brought to mind and are of great concern when we review our Dayton Reunion and proposed plans for our Indy 87' Reunion. When the facts of these are addressed we hold deep concerns that if corrective steps aren't taken we can price ourselves out of the Reunion business. Fact--at Dayton we paid those Hilton 'gangsters' exhorbitant prices for unadulterated 'crap'. Fact--at Indy 87' when a couple attends the Thursday evening Ice Breaker and the Saturday evening Banquet their price of admission for these two events will be \$101.80 out of the \$325 Hotel package. We may well be the 'Village Idiot' for complaining. We don't think so based on the many letters and calls received regarding same. We feel and agree this is living too damed high on the hog for many of our members. What about our old comrades, who shared so much with us, that may have been less fortunate? Have we considered perhaps they have even a stronger desire to stand and share with us once again? Shouldn't we consider with the years and events not being as kind to them and their families such an expense may be too stout for their pocket books? Have we considered our thoughtless actions may dictate they must forego attending and necessitate their sitting home with an undeserved case of the 'Poor Me's'? Personally, and we feel we speak for many, we would be willing to forego gourmet buffets and banquets. 'Blue Plate Specials' would be enjoyed a damned sight more if they could be shared with 'Old Friends' that have been prohibited from attending because we lacked the consideration to set our sights lower remembering we were once a Squadron that cared and shared. In short--if hundreds of other units can hold more economical priced Reunions--why can't we?

Having fired our criticism cannon, no doubt by now, Harry Greene has progressed from an epileptic seizure to cardiac arrest back to yelling at poor Rick to prepare him another pop of Canadian Windsor to soothe his distress.
