"The Addendum"

"AMERETTO" BY Geneva

- 2 Cups of Vodka
- 2 Cups of Sugar
- 1 3/4 Cups of Water
- 4 Tsp. Almond Extract
- 2 Tsp. Vanilla Extract
- 1 Tsp. Chocolate Extract
- 1 lemon Peel

Put the sugar and lemon in a pot of water and cook at hight temperature for 10 minutes, (constantly stir the brew) Remove the peel, take the pot off the burner and add all the ingredients and stir well. Allow to cool and it is ready to drink.

Use inexpensive Vodka, the finished product is just as good with whatever brand you may choose to use.
