





## They Will Not Be Forgotten

A GRATEFUL 783RD BOMB SQUADRON ASSOCIATION

PAUL HOOGE-made his final flite to Eagle's Nest 7-12-08. Paul will be remembered as the Engineer on the Swanzy crew that fateful day when 'scragged' on the Nimes, France raid 7-12-44 some 64 years to the day earlier while on his 31st mission. Although wounded he managed to evade capture some 7 days before making contact with the underground. This group spent 4 months aiding him reach the coast where he was smuggled aboard a fishing boat and transported to Isle of Sardinia and later returned to the states. Following his service days he became a Produce Buyer making quite a name in that field with his many innovations. Recognizing his expertise many large firms employed the services of the L. A. Hooge Company to purchase large shipments of vegetables & fruits from the growers. He was the innovator of many new packing & shipping methods plus adapting large shipments by refrigerated trucks to nationwide markets. Over the years Paul acquired quite a reputatation for his fair dealing. Lage growers with hundreds of acres of fruits & vegetables became accustomed to merely placing calls to him when harvesting time came with not so much as a mention of the price expected. While head of the Poteet Chamber of Commerce he helped institute the annual Poteet Strawberry Festival that has since become a regional happening attended annualy by thousands. Additionally, he spent much time in the Rio Grande Valley purchasing large shipments of citrus & vegetables for shipment all over the United States. In September of 2000 Paul was inducted into the Texas Produce Hall of Fame located in McAllen, TX. At the time of passing he was still active servicing his many large clients. He is survived by his wife Catherine; daughters, Sandra Fewell, Paula Yarosh; sister, Rosalie Allsup; brother, Leon Hooge; grand-daughters, Nicole Fewell Nelson, Michelle Wessel; & great grandson, Miles Nelson.

MAJOR RALPH SMITH, USAF RET-made his final flite to Eagle's Nest 7-23-08. Small in statue 'Smitty' had fought a gigantic health battle for an extended period of time. In recent months this struggle had been complicated when he suffered a severe stroke. His daughter reported, "He had been recovering nicely from the stroke but was still fragile, so was taken rather suddenly". He will be remembered as the Bombardier on the Swanzy Crew one of the original 17. This was the crew 'scragged' by ME 109s on the 7-12-44 raid on Nimes, France. Hooking up with the French underground he spent a harrowing six weeks evading capture before being returned to allied control and a trip back to the USA. On his return to the states he completed Navigation training at Ellington Field, TX and began a long successful Air Force Career that included tours in Japan in A-26s; a tour in Guam in B-29S and later with a Troop Carrier Squadron hauling passengers & cargo; followed by participation in the Berlin airlift; service with the 97th Bomb Wing in El Paso; next came duty flying with a Strategic support Squadron supporting SAC missions ranging as far west as Japan & as far east as England, Spain & Africa; next duty in St Johns, Newfoundland with a Air Transport Squadron; followed by duty at Davis Monthan where he commanded an Airways & Communications Squadron; retiring as CO of an AACS Squadron at Edwards AFB Flight Test Center providing support for the X-15 program--ending one helluva flying career. Having married the love of his life Kathryn he returned to his beloved Maine ultimately retiring as Corporate Trust Supervisor with a large Bank in Portland, ME. Many reunion attendees will recall his serving the Association as President from 1993-95 and a long time Board member. He is survived by his wife, Kathryn; daughter Peggy Friar (Glenn); son, Bernard Smith (Debbie) and grandchildren Melisse & Jessie Smith.

#### 64 YEARS LATER

After landing in Venice, Italy and boarding the cruise liner Emerald Princess the next 3 weeks were spent touring Venice, Athens, Kusadasi, Ephesus, Istanbul, Mykanos, Naples, Capri, Sorrento, Pompeii, Citavecchia, Rome, Livorno, Florence, Tuscany, Marseille, Avignon & Barcelona. On our earlier visit much of the various areas had only been seen from 20,000'. On the ground revealed surprising development progress. Having arrived & departed from Naples on our earlier visit this time we hardly recognized it as being the same. The port was thriving industrially enlarged tremendously & clear of the many sunken ships. Where Naples ended and Sorrento began could not be determined continuing on much further south. Both tremendous industrial as well as residential development was witnessed at all areas from Istanbul on the east and in all areas back around to Barcelona on the west. At each and every stop traffic was bumper to bumper even though the price of gasoline sold by the liter when converted to a per gallon price ranged from \$7 the cheapest to \$11/gal. Contrary to what the products of the American Educational System -- the news media report--employment is high; wages long ago adjusted to high energy prices; the majority of families enjoying 2 autos; with their stores carrying the same quality

goods although much higher priced. Example- the lowest price paid for a diet coke off the ship was \$3.5 Euros-converted to USA \$5.46. The ladies latest dressing fad for both old & young--slim or fat--is slim legged blue jeans beginning at \$195 Euros. On disembarking during our stay in Barcelona an inside room with twin beds & no window so small I sat one of the beds & Lynda set on the only chair beside the door at the Majestic Hotel--you would not believe the exorbitant price. Yet, it was full with the desk turning away travelers.

In Italy as an experiment at each and every town traveled we offered the American dollar for a purchase. Thanks to each and every American voting for our two bit Congress Persons the American dollar was refused—Euros only. At the banks you experienced a discounted price from the posted exchange rate--proving again the loss of value for the American dollar once so valued and respected. The same applied for Greece, Turkey & France. For this situation each & every American voter must accept his or her responsibility.

#### LIFE CAN BE SO FRAGILE & SHORT

DR GARY FORSBERG-the August 17, 2008 Sierra Vista, AZ Herald Review reported," a local doctor died Friday night after suffering a gunshot wound, according to city police. Dr Gary Forsberg, 61, a radiologist at the Sierra Vista Regional Health Center, was shot when he and his wife, Beverly Forsberg, whose age was not released by police, were handling a gun in their Sierra Vista home about 9:50 p.m., police reported on Saturday. Forsberg's wife called authorities for help, and Sierra Vista Fire Department Medics responded. Forsberg was taken to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead. Police had no further details of the incident available on Saturday. The department said its Special Operation Bureau is conducting the investigation and served a search warrant at the couple's home in an effort to examine potential evidence. Once the investigation is complete, the case will be forwarded to the Cochise County Attorney's Office, police said. Forsberg had been active in local Republican Party activities, said Gail Griffin, chairwoman of the Cochise County Republican Party. It is a great loss, she said after hearing the news of his death on Saturday. He attended many functions and was a great supporter. In January, Forsberg was one of the cooks in the "Men Who Cook" fund raiser for the Sierra Vista Symphony Orchestra "end of quote.

Gary will be remembered as the son of our Dell & Irene Forsberg. On attending our Tucson Reunion he immediately became vaccinated with the Quid Fit spirit joining & becoming a dues paying member of our Association. At the Charleston Reunion he was in attendance giving his father a hand who was by then dependent on a wheel chair. He was noted spending hours in front of the DVD player viewing the various discs Bob Wills had made while asking many questions.
